SERIES: Resurrection Reality

Paul writes, "Christ has *indeed* been raised from the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Big word: *Indeed!* Paul is stressing that we must not think of Jesus' resurrection like a happy ending to another epic fable. The resurrection is not legend—it really happened. Easter is not just a holiday—it is *history*. On time's infinite line, Jesus' resurrection is the moment that defines reality for us all. If Christ remained dead, he is a fraud and failure. If Christ remained dead, then the grave is the final, ugly, rotten end of us all. But *Christ has indeed been raised.* So, the reality is: Jesus is exactly what he claimed to be—the Son of God, our Lord and Savior. And his resurrection proves that "all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). The reality of the resurrection does not *just* change our future, but also the way we look at life *now*.

Today and throughout this series, we will meditate on the breathtaking implications of the resurrection reality.

TODAY'S FOCUS: Our Business Is Love

The entirety of God's Word can be summed up in one word: love. God's Law is all about love. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart..." and "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37,39). The gospel is all about love: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son..." (John 3:16). From his compassion for the sick and broken, to his sacrificial death on the cross, to the peace he provided after his resurrection, Jesus was the perfect embodiment of love. Love is his business.

Therefore, love is our business too. The resurrection reality is that with the same supernatural power by which God raised Jesus from the dead, God now enables us to live a new life—one marked by radically selfless love. The motivation and ability to do this comes from seeing the endless love Christ has for us. We love only because he first loved us.



CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

P(astor): Jesus is risen, we believe it, we hear it, and we still struggle, fail, and fall short every day. We don't listen to the voice of Jesus as we should. We don't trust in his works, which back up his wonderful words. We do our own thing. Let's confess our sins to our Savior.

C(ongregation): Lord Jesus, I confess that I am sinful because of things I think, things I say, and things I do.

I make promises and fail to keep them.

I speak words but fail to act.


I can never successfully back up my love for you or anyone with my works. Lord, I am sorry for my sins.

Have mercy on me, Jesus.

(silence for private confession)

P: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins (Ephesians 2:4,5). By the death and resurrection of God's Son Jesus Christ, death has been swallowed up forever (1 Corinthians 15:54). Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen!







ACTS 9:36-42 Because Tabitha loved Jesus, she was always helping the poor in the town of Joppa. Because Jesus loved the people of Joppa, he had Peter raise Tabitha from the dead.

³⁶ In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (in Greek her name is Dorcas); she was always doing good and helping the poor. ³⁷ About that time she became sick and died, and her body was washed and placed in an upstairs room. ³⁸ Lydda was near Joppa; so when the disciples heard that Peter was in Lydda, they sent two men to him and urged him, "Please come at once!"

³⁹ Peter went with them, and when he arrived he was taken upstairs to the room. All the widows stood around him, crying and showing him the robes and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was still with them.

⁴⁰ Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up. ⁴¹ He took her by the hand and helped her to her feet. Then he called for the believers, especially the widows, and presented her to them alive. ⁴² This became known all over Joppa, and many people believed in the Lord.

THE CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

1 JOHN 4:7-11, 19-21 | Friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. ²¹ And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.



⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.




PRAYER
